MONTHLY COMMUNITY MEAL

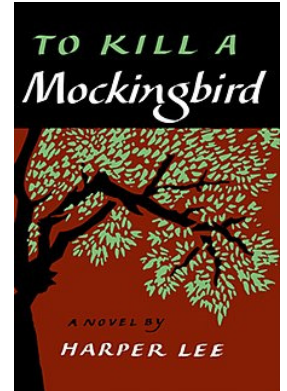
Saturday, Nov. 24 – 6:00 p.m.
