FIRST READING

Word

Daniel 7:9–10, 13–14

⁹As I watched, thrones were set in place, and an Ancient One took his throne, his clothing was white as snow, and the hair of his head like pure wool; his throne was fiery flames, and its wheels were burning fire. ¹⁰A stream of fire issued and flowed out from his presence. A thousand thousands served him, and ten thousand times ten thousand stood attending him. The court sat in judgment, and the books were opened. ¹³As I watched in the night visions, I saw one like a human being coming with the clouds of heaven. And he came to the Ancient One and was presented before him. ¹⁴To him was given dominion and glory and kingship, that all peoples, nations, and languages should serve him. His dominion is an everlasting dominion that shall not pass away, and his kingship is one that shall never be destroyed.

Introduction to the Day

Even after Israel had experienced the vagaries of kings, they still longed for a true king to set things right. He would have the king's title of Anointed One (Messiah); he would be the "one like a human being" (Son of Man) given dominion in Daniel's vision. Jesus is given these titles, even though he is nothing like an earthly king. His authority comes from the truth to which he bears witness, and those who recognize the truth voluntarily listen to him. We look forward to the day he is given dominion, knowing his victory will be the nonviolent victory of love.

Offertory Anthem

In this exceedingly thoughtful text, Dunstan reflects for us some of the rich variety of Christological titles, metaphors, and descriptions to be found within the Scriptures. The writers of Scripture tried to express Jesus Christ's uniqueness with everything they had, with what Martin Hengel once called "a multiplicity of approximations."

What's interesting here is that Dunstan also gives us paradoxes generated by the sheer abnormality of evil and the fact that prima facie evil is needed to defeat actual evil: hence Christ makes peace by bloodshed; he gains victory by a magnificent defeat. In a distinct but related set of paradoxes that conclude each stanza, Dunstan cites our own ambivalence toward Christ: we scorn and crave him: we want him and we don't; he is God's gift, but we have to count the cost of following him. Finally, in the last line of the hymn this ambivalence meets paradox: God slays in order to save.




