October and November were busy months for congregational input. The Call Committee offered two invitations and you responded well. Thank you! What you shared is helping both the Call Committee and the Mission Site Profile (MSP) writing team. Thank you for sharing what you are excited about at GA and what you believe is needed in a new leader. All this to continue living into our calling as God's people together. And, humanly speaking as well, a healthy church family adds strength to its community, neighborhood, and the individual lives of its members. Period!

The figures above represent our income/expenses through October 31, 2022.

October 2022 YTD Actual Income of \$247,547.87 represents 86% of our budgeted \$287,345.04. October 2022 YTD Expenses of \$259,149.71 represent 90% of our budgeted \$287,344.98. The -\$11,601.84 difference constitutes our YTD deficit.

As compared to last year, YTD our income is -\$42,428.07 and our expenses are up \$2,908.05.
