Neighborhood Walks Are Back!

Join the Congregational Life and Social Ministry committees on neighborhood walks this summer! Walking within our community is a great way for our congregation to be present and learn about our surroundings. We have multiple days planned with varying distances, so hope you find a time to walk with us.

- When? The first Thursday of the month at 6:00 p.m., and third Sunday of each month following worship.
- Weather? As long as it's not raining, we will walk!
- How far? Thursday evening walks will be longer walks expect between 1.5-2.0 miles. Sunday walks will be shorter only about 6 blocks round trip (with a coffee break at the halfway mark).
- ♦ Treats? Always.

Thursday, June 1: We will walk from GA to Windom Park/Mt.
Carmel and then end at Parkway Pizza for Sebastian Joe's ice cream; this walk will be about two miles.

Sunday, June 18: Third Sunday walk to coffee hour at The Coffee Shop NE. Note that this walk will take place after the special congregational meeting.

Thoughts on Transitions from Pastor Sara

Greetings, my friends!

I see my time with you starting to wind down. I'm sad, but deeply satisfied, too. With a new pastor vote due mid-month (see front page), I know that's the signal to start preparing my heart and assembling my files. Plus, we have some unique "staffing navigation" to do in this summer's transition. That is, we have Phil's sabbatical thrown into the mix! I'm thrilled for him and will do my best to help things run smoothly. We can do it!



I will not write here about the files and notes I'll assemble (you're welcome!) for your next pastor, but let me say a few things about *getting ready inwardly*. While you get ready to meet a new pastor (more in a minute), I'll be getting ready to meet a new congregation and I have some *soul work* to do, because I was really here. Throughout my time, we worked hard and did things!

And, I wonder if you have some work to do, too. Heart work, self talk, expectations. A few action steps, too.

Here are my thoughts for GA as you walk toward another leadership transition, one in which there is hope, joy, and *a long-term vision*! It is always worth it to start well in a new relationship, and this one will be that, too — worth it.

1—**Ignore**. When you've had some misses [in relationships], whether individually or collectively, it can be helpful, when preparing to begin again, to ignore any negative thought patterns that set you up for failure. Like suspicion, distrust, judgment. That is, as you prepare to welcome a new pastor, set aside the narratives, within you and among you, that expect the worst. Setting these narratives aside helps you be a bit more honest and open-hearted with the new pastor, gives them a chance to be good and true, enjoyable and trustworthy. Trust that God will give you discernment and wisdom when these are needed, too.

2—Initiate. Make plans now. Determine that you will reach out first, even with a new pastor. Don't wait for them to take the first step or even initiate the first conversation! Sometimes it takes just a walk across the room, to let them know your name and your heartfelt welcome, and begin the path of clear communication and mutual respect.

3—Invite. As long as you are initiating a conversation, consider inviting your new pastor to a group meeting or social gathering, too! Being part of smaller group conversations can be a powerful way for someone new to feel invited "in," get the feel for relationships and attitudes in a congregation. If you don't have a group, pull one together. Just add beverage and/or food, and snap, you can work miracles between people, even with pastors!

It may not *quite* be time to start planning your welcome of GA's new pastor, but it is definitely time to begin praying about what you want to do, who you want to be, in this transition. First, you and I will say our good-byes and our thank you's, then, you'll be ready for something new again, something worth investing in!

The Council is focused this month on supporting our congregation in completing the final stages of calling our settled pastor. As noted on the front page, we will host a congregational meeting on June 18.

April 2023 YTD Actual Income of \$95,499.74 represents 81% of our budgeted \$117,729.72. April 2023 YTD Expenses of \$119,658.34 represent 102% of our budgeted \$117,729.48. The -\$24,158.60 difference constitutes our YTD deficit.

As compared to last year, YTD our income is \$1,806.78 and our expenses are up \$5,942.33.

Today we are pleased to honor our following five high school graduates:


