Deacon Phil Is Going on Sabbatical!

Deacon Phil will be on sabbatical leave from June 26-August 6. This fact has been shared for a while with the congregation. He has been working diligently to get all his "ducks in a row" to cover his duties while he is away from GA Church. Pastor Sara, Joel Lurvey, members of the Mutual Ministry Committee, and others in the congregation are going to be very helpful in making things run smoothly in his absence.

What will Phil be doing while he is on leave, you might be wondering?

The answer is: a variety of things! He will be gone from Minnesota for the first the first three weeks – visiting his sister in Reading, Pennsylvania, attending the Association of Lutheran Church Musicians National Conference in Philadelphia, and attending the Handbell Musicians of America National Conference in Dallas.



When he is back in Minnesota, he will take some time for relaxation and renewal and will also be practicing (at Mt. Carmel Church) for a recital he will present at GA sometime this fall. There will be one more church music workshop he will attend – here in the Twin Cities in late July. He also plans to be open to the spirit for other activities during those last three weeks of sabbatical, including the possibility of meeting with a spiritual director once or twice.

Neighborhood Walks Continue in July & August

Join the Congregational Life and Social Ministry committees on neighborhood walks this summer! Church Council Report

Pastor Ian Coen-Frei accepted our invitation to join Gustavus Adolphus! Thank you for your support and prayers during this journey.

At the congregational meeting, several questions came up that council considered:

Q: Will there be a meet and greet?

A: Yes. We've agreed upon a start date of August 7. Pastor Ian is anxious to meet us too, and the Council will ensure that we have an opportunity (or two) to get to know one another.

Q: When and how will we say good-bye to Pastor Sara?

A: Pastor Sara's last day will be Monday, July 31. On Sunday, July 30, the Council is working with the Congregational Life committee for a special coffee hour.

Q: Will Pastor Ian be full-time and what are the financial details?

A: Pastor Ian will be full-time. We negotiated a total compensation package that falls within our existing budget. We will revisit salaries for the 2025 budget.

Q: How can our congregation be supportive and prepare for a successful tenure with Pastor lan?

A: Our congregation has completed a thoughtful interim period (that included a pandemic and many other unexpected events). We identified our strengths and were honest about our shortcomings. The Council is committed to ensuring that we address our gaps by establishing systems and practices. Examples include:

- Approving an employee handbook created by our ad hoc HR committee, and ensuring other common employment documents, such as organization charts, exist.
- Collaborating with the Mutual Ministry committee to create safe spaces for employees <u>and</u> congregation members to process concerns and conflicts, and to ensure each employee of GA has someone intentionally supporting them.
- Collaborating with our Finance committee to ensure we are prioritizing our budget in a way that reflects our values and also, clearly communicating to congregation members our financial status and choices that we must make.
- Collaborating with our Property committee to match the resources generously provided through our Capital Campaign to our improvement priorities.

The Council will be taking July off for meetings, but will reconvene in August. We are planning on a September retreat with Pastor Ian.

Opportunities & Thank You's

The Council relies heavily on others to support Gustavus Adolphus. Each month we will highlight volunteers who are implementing plans to support our *Life Together*, and make suggestions on how others might get involved.

Thank you to everyone who is stepping up to support our congregation with Deacon Phil is on his sabbatical! Kristin Tangen will be sending the weekly emails. Jenny Parker will be handling the worship assistant calendar. Shirley Fors and the Tangens will make sure the sanctuary is cooled for each Sunday's worship. Pastor Sara and Joel Lurvey will be helping behind the scenes to make sure other things runs smoothly in Deacon Phil's absence, as will other members of the Mutual Ministry Committee – and most likely other people who are not named here. Note from the Treasurer

Happy Summer y'all!

So Good News, News for Prayerful Consideration.

<u>Good News!</u> We were awarded money from the federal government for the Employee Retention Credit as a part of Covid relief. This is a one-time gift and there aren't (that we know of right now) going to be any more funds available from the government for anything Covid-related.



All committees will continue to look for opportunities to help us but these are not things that we should rely on when we approve our budgets.

<u>News for Prayerful Consideration.</u> We are down to 68 giving units through the first quarter of the year, and we continue to be between \$3,000 - \$5,000 below what we need each month for our expenses. If we are not able to find other financial opportunities, we would be at about -\$60,000 every year. We are committed to now going down that path but we want our giving to be able to support our budget and give us the chance to have a cushion for emergencies (that we don't have now).

Finance is always looking into the future and to make everyone aware of where we're headed and always working to bring our expenses in line with our income.

So Good News, we have a surplus. Not so great news, the only reason we have that surplus is because of an almost \$30K grant from the government.

Just a friendly reminder of what the ideal giving would need to be for each of the 68 giving units:

- \$87.40 every week OR
- \$378.60/month OR
- \$4,545 yearly

We know there are members who give gifts in stocks and end-of-year gifts as well (and that's AMAZING!).

We know that you may already feel strapped and we totally get that.

The figures above represent our income/expenses through May 31, 2023.

May 2023 YTD Actual Income of \$148,560.90 represents 100% of our budgeted \$147,162.13. May 2023 YTD Expenses of \$145,004.44 represents 98% of our budgeted \$147,161.92. The \$3,556 difference constitutes our YTD surplus.

As compared to last year, YTD our income is up \$20,565.39 and our expenses are up \$2,520.26.
