From Pastor Ian

Siblings in Christ,

As we reflect on the recent Thanksgiving festivities, it becomes evident that we've swiftly transitioned into the Christmas season. In our household, the tree is already adorned, garlands draped, and the windows aglow with



lights. While some of these preparations stem from practical considerations—long-lasting memories of bundling up against the cold to string lights as a child—there's a deeper reason. The warmth of a house adorned with twinkling lights can bring comfort as daylight disappears, and the nights lengthen. Soon, we will gather at church with lit candles on Christmas Eve, joyously commemorating the birth of Jesus.

Between the joyous aftermath of Thanksgiving and the exuberance of Christmas lies the blessed season of Advent—a brief interlude of waiting and watching. Advent provides us with the precious space to anticipate the Christmas joy while simultaneously looking forward to God's imminent presence, poised to breathe life into our weary world.

In addition to Advent gracing us with what I believe is the most beautiful liturgical color (Blue!), it gifts us with the opportunity to lift our voices in song, resonating with familiar and beloved hymns. From "Come Thou Long Expected Jesus" (ELW 254) to "Joy to the World" (ELW 267) and "O Come, O Come, Emmanuel" (ELW 257), our spirits are uplifted. Among these, one hymn that has occupied my thoughts in this preparatory season is "Unexpected and Mysterious" (ELW 258). Penned in 2002, this hymn eloquently captures the incomprehensible nature of God's entrance into the world through Jesus.

"We are called to ponder mystery and await the coming Christ, To embody God's compassion for each fragile human life. God is with us in our longing to bring healing to the earth, While we watch with joy and wonder for the promised savior's birth."

This hymn resonates with the paradoxical essence of our faith and worship. As we eagerly await the celebration of Jesus' birth at Christmas—the divine incarnation—we also acknowledge that God is already present with us amid the world's trials and tribulations. Christmas is celebrated not only as the anticipation of a future promise but also as a recognition of the present reality.

This Advent, my prayer is that we discover ways to experience God's presence amidst the hustle and bustle. May our anticipation of Jesus' arrival in the manger coexist with the acknowledgment of God journeying beside us in our waking and sleeping moments. Through this recognition in Advent, may our celebration of Jesus' birth kindle a fresh and enduring joy.

Church Council Report

As this year comes to a close, the council is earnestly preparing for 2024; our primary task is ensuring we have a balanced budget.

We see so much potential in GA's future:

- •After several years, we have a full settled staff that includes a full time pastor and deacon. This is a blessing that most churches of our size do not get to enjoy.
- •We see increased trends in giving, including a positive response to our requests for special giving in November.
- •We have early indicators of increased giving trends for 2024.
- •Our Life Together capital appeal will provide the necessary funds to make needed building repairs.
- •We have a strong stewardship plan in place.

Yet, we need to allow time for these investments to grow. We also recognize that we lost a revenue stream with the English Language school renters moving out. While we take the time to reset financially, our council advises making short term reductions in the 2024 budget.

We're still showing a deficit, but I know that there have been numerous people doubling their giving for one month (those gifts will reflected next month).




We also had a call to raise money to plow the other parking lot, and we raised that money within a week!!!

As compared to last year, YTD our income is up \$32,150.07 and our expenses are up \$35,628.40.


