Plan to attend our annual Congregational Meeting on Sunday,

January 28, after worship. Like our worship services, the meeting will be a hybrid meeting – you can attend in person in the sanctuary or via Zoom. As is the case every year, we'll hear reports from staff and committees, hear a presentation and approve an operating budget for 2024, and elect several church council members for 2024. This year, we will also take a second vote on the proposed changes to our church constitution (the first vote was taken at our meeting on December 17) and hear updates on our capital campaign, including potentially voting on a plan for upgrades to our audio/visual system. Copies of the proposed 2024 budget will be available at church the week before the meeting.

From Pastor Ian

It is with joy that I think back to our Christmas Eve worship together. Gathering in the darkened space with candles lit and voices raised can feel like a unique and special experience for people who usually worship in the morning. And this year, in 2024 we will be adding



another opportunity for an evening worship opportunity on March 30: the Easter Vigil. Explaining the vigil, Pr. Craig Mueller writes,

In the early centuries of the Church, before there was a church year and Easter Day services as we know them, the Easter Vigil was the annual, unitive celebration of Jesus' death and resurrection in one service. It was most often held as an all-night Vigil, but the essentials then and now remain the same: a service of light around the paschal candle; readings from the Hebrew scriptures as pictures of resurrection; adult baptisms by immersion; and eucharist. In the past several decades churches of many denominations have restored the Easter Vigil to its rightful place as the "queen of feasts."

The service is one that is multi-sensory and encourages active participation. It begins outside by the campfire, where we will light a new Paschal candle (which will be made by the confirmation students this year) and then carry it into the darkened sanctuary. Then we will share in readings from the Hebrew bible, with some dramatically read, and others sung responsively, and possibly some acted out. After the reading of the gospel, we will be reminded of the promise of baptism (or even possibly baptize!), and then we will join in the celebration of the meal.

In the next few months, I will be sharing more about this service through the "Gazette" and by other means, and I hope that you will be curious about this vigil. There are many different ways that Easter vigils have been celebrated over the years. While we will be using the tradition of the vigil as our starting point, my hope is that the celebration of this historic service will be unique to GA, reflecting the people who call this their church home. It will not be "another" worship service to attend, but rather will be "the" worship service to look forward to! To anticipate with joy.

Our goal is to turn off Vanco by 1/31/2024, but we encourage you to start using Breeze right away! Here's how to get started.

Next Steps for One-Time Gifts

Going forward, if you'd like to give a one-time gift, simply give using Breeze instead of Vanco by going to Donations page of our website and following the instructions on the page.

Or...text the amount you'd like to donate (example: 50) to (612) 887-1797 and follow the prompts for a one-time set up. In the future, you'll simply be able to text the gift amount to our giving number and hit send!

Next Steps for Recurring Givers

If you're a Recurring Giver in Vanco, first cancel the gift within the Vanco system. <u>If you need help doing this, please reach out to Deacon Phil or Pastor Ian to ensure this is done correctly.</u>



- ◆ Then, go to our Giving Page on our website
- ♦ Enter the amount you'd like to give
- Click the dropdown that shows the words "one time gift' and select a different frequency from the menu (weekly, every two weeks, monthly, yearly)
- Select your Payment Method and click "Continue"
- Now, enter your Contact and Payment Information and choose if you would like to cover the processing fees
- ♦ Click the "Give \$" button

If you ever want to change or modify your recurring gift, you will be able to do so through a link that is included in the confirmation email after your first gift is processed.
