As in the past several years, these services are hybrid – you can attend in-person or online. A Zoom link for all the Wednesday services is shared in each Saturday's email newsletter.

We have many wonderful opportunities during the Lenten season to gather with our community for meals and worship. This can be a deepening time in our faith journey. Meals will be served every Wednesday through March 20 at 6:00 p.m. (prior to Evening Prayer).

These last few months, I have been sharing about the Easter Vigil that we are introducing to GA this year. I have shared about how the service will be multisensory, with ways that our whole bodies will actively participate in the worship. Then last month, I shared how the outline of the service will be familiar to a Sunday morning service, but with every aspect given more attention and space than Sunday worship might allow. With Lent upon us, I wanted to use this gazette article as a space to concretely address questions that have been asked in the past few weeks.

"I remember attending an Easter Vigil worship service at a church I attended previously, and the service didn't start until really late and it was reall!!!!!!!!!!!!! long. Are we going to be up all night for this?"

No, we won't be up all night as part of this service. It will begin at 7 p.m. like all of our Holy Week services, and the candlelight nature of the service will foster a beautiful atmosphere. With the selection of readings in addition to the Affirmation of Baptism, it will be longer than a regular Sunday morning worship. But with the ways the readings and service are structured, it will feel very engaging, and should be about 1 hour and 45 minutes long.

"Why are we going to celebrate the resurrection on Saturday night? Didn't Jesus rise on the "Third Day," meaning Sunday?"

It is true that we profess that Jesus rose on the third day. According to Jewish reckoning, one day is over and the next begins at sundown, and so the Easter Vigil carries on this tradition of celebrating the great Vigil of Easter on Saturday night. And surrounding this worship, we know that Jesus' rising from the dead is not dependent on when we gather, but rather as a community we can choose to celebrate Jesus' rising in the present.

"Why have I never heard of an Easter Vigil before this year, and does this mean I missed something in confirmation?"

No, you didn't miss anything in confirmation. While the Easter Vigil is an ancient worship service, it fell out of practice in many traditions during the middle ages, and only recently (in the last 50 years) has it begun to be reintroduced to churches. Through having an Easter Vigil service, we will be connecting with Christians of different traditions (especially the Roman Catholic church) and demonstrate in the unity of our faith!

"Will there be a social time following the worship?"

No, there will not be a formal reception following the Easter Vigil service. While many congregations celebrate breaking the Lenten fast with festive food and drink after their Vigil, we will be saving that celebration for following worship on Sunday morning. The focus of this first Easter vigil at GA is to introduce the beauty of the worship. In following years we might add the festive celebration following the vigil.

Now, this certainly isn't an exhaustive list of all the questions I have been asked, and if you have any other curiosities about this festive worship, please reach out! I hope that as we continue journeying through Lent, you might be moved to join in this unique service on <u>Saturday</u>, <u>March 30</u>, at 7 p.m. It will be a wonderful opportunity to gather and celebrate the joy of the resurrection in community in a new (yet ancient) manner.

We'll have one rehearsal on Saturday, March 23, at 10:00 a.m. in the

## GA Choir Update

We are so happy that our adult choir is now up to 16 singers. You can probably tell they have a fuller sound on Sunday mornings. This is great! However, we could use a more balanced group voice-wise. Right now, we have 13 sopranos and altos and three tenors and basses; we could use more tenors and basses! I know there are some low-voiced singers out there in the congregation who could be part of our choir. And just to be clear, we're not turning away new sopranos or altos either! There is still time to join the choir for the rest of this season. Think about it! We practice on Wednesday nights from 7:30-8:30 p.m. and sing for worship on the first and fourth Sundays of the month (plus Good Friday and Easter upcoming).

# Northeast Chorale Spring Geason Coming Up

GA Church is host to the Northeast Chorale – a community choir of approximately 45 voices that I am privileged to direct. The Chorale will be starting its spring season this month…on Tuesday, March 19, at 6:30 p.m. with a pot luck supper and sing-through of our spring music. Regular rehearsals will commence the following Tuesday and continue until our spring concert weekend on June 1 and 2. The Chorale is open to high school and adult singers; no auditions are required. There is a \$25.00 participation fee for adults and \$15.00 for students. If you have questions, you can find me or Carlotta Rosebrock, who is a member of the Chorale's board of directors. We generally have a group of singers from GA in the Chorale, and we'd love to welcome more GA folks.

# Remind Me Again How the Organ Plays By Itself!

It's been several years since I've addressed this topic, and I always get some quizzical looks when the organ is playing "Lamb of God" or another Communion hymn and I'm downstairs to receive Communion. Our organ is a digital/pipe organ hybrid that is "run" by a computer. Therefore, it is capable of communicating with a MIDI module, which we have connected to the organ. MIDI stands for "Musical Instrument Digital Interface" — a technology developed in the 1980's to allow digital instruments to communicate with each other. This allows me to play and "record" music from the organ to the MIDI module and store it there and play it back at a later time. It plays back exactly what I record. So when someone asks me, "Who's playing the organ?" — the answer is: "I am!" It also allows me, on occasion, to record an accompaniment to a choir anthem and direct the choir while the organ plays the accompaniment. It's really wonderful technology (when used sparingly!).

# Holy Week and Easter Worship

I am very much looking forward to the addition of the Easter Vigil to our worship schedule this year. I encourage you to attend all our Holy Week services. Each one offers its own unique and rich part of the Passion story that is so important to our Christian faith. Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, and now the Easter Vigil, and of course Easter morning...each one is so meaningful. We will have a brass quartet, choir, and handbells sharing music on Easter morning for our festival worship service. May you experience God's real presence in your life as you participate in worship this Holy Week and Easter!

#### 110 Years of Celebrations!


For 110 years, GA has been a place where community gathers and community celebrates. For the 110th Anniversary


congregation. We will subsidize one-half of whatever tier you choose for your camp this summer!
