Street Clean-up for Earth Day Sunday, April 21

Meet at Mount Carmel (1701 St. Anthony Parkway) at 11:00 a.m. (after worship) to get your vest, grabbers, gloves, and bags and to get excited about being stewards of creation! We'll then head out to make the world a better place between 26th and 32nd and Johnson.





One of my favorite aspects of the season of Easter is a renewed focus on baptism! While our Lutheran tradition encourages baptismal remembrance throughout the year, there are a few markers within our worship that will especially remind us of our life as the baptized people of God.

First, the Paschal (baptismal/Easter) candle will be lit through the 50 days of Easter. This is the candle which we use during baptisms throughout the year, and from which the baptismal candidates' candles are lit. New to GA this year is that our Paschal candle was designed by the confirmation students and is made from the old altar candles-melted down, and re-poured. Prominent in the design is the rainbow that represents new life, and God's promise to always be with creation.

Second, for the Easter season, rather than the confession and forgiveness, we will share in the thanksgiving for baptism at the beginning of worship. This aspect of the liturgy helps us to remember the ways in which God has acted through water in history, and calls us forth to give thanks for the waters that continue to free creation from sin and oppression. And we will join in the refrain:

Look, here is water!

Here is our water of life! Alleluia!

The third reminder of our baptism will happen as the Hymn of Praise "This is the Feast of Victory" is sung. The presider and assisting minister will use the ancient practices of asperges—the sprinkling of baptismal water on folks using an Aspergilla (holy water sprinkler). While you might have seen pictures or video of priests using something that looks like a child's rattle, the aspergillum we will be using at GA are small handmade brushes. As we sing, the presider and assisting minister will move through the sanctuary, and you will feel water from the baptismal font. You are encouraged to make the sign of the cross-echoing your own baptism! **And a practical note, if possible, those who have glasses should remove them to prevent water spots.**

This Easter season, within worship we will be encountering beautiful reminders of our shared baptismal identity. I pray that fed by the word and meal, we might bear our baptismal hope to all the places we may be found.

110 Years of Celebrations!





Church Council Update

Council spent the month thinking about the most pressing short and long term needs of our life together at GA. Thank you to those who joined our coffee hour conversations or sought out council members to share your observations! We want to be intentional about how we spend our time and energy this year.

We are fortunate to have a strong committee structure that supports our life together. Because of these volunteer leaders who share their time and skills, we are able to accomplish even more. Our committees are addressing many of the issues that GA members identified as important. For example, taking care of our property, managing our finances responsibly, and connecting with each other and the broader community.

Meanwhile, the council is going prioritize two needs:

- Developing a plan and engaging a realtor to lease space vacated last year. A new renter can provide an important source of revenue for our church and a vibrancy to the building during the week.
- 2. Our Life Together Capital Campaign promised to dedicate 10% of its collected income to others. Though we will likely wait until we collect more of the pledged funds before we distribute to outside groups, the council will develop a plan for a community needs assessment to inform that decision. This builds upon the work of our Social Ministry committee who not only allocates our Benevolence funds each year, but also is developing relationships with our neighbors.

Can you help? We are forming a short term task force to put together the information we need to lease our space. Thank you to our property committee for addressing the building improvements to get the space in shape to rent. If you know something about commercial real estate and can be involved with helping the council take the next steps, let us know!



Hello from Kraków, Poland!

GA members Sarah Larson, Matt Brown, and Connor Arneson spent this Palm Sunday in Kraków, Poland, where they witnessed the annual Palm Procession. A bit short on local palm trees, Catholic Poles traditionally create their own elaborate "palms" from native trees and flowers. This year, 28 different towns, organizations, and churches from around Poland came to Krakow to show off their creations. After a procession from the old city gate to the market square, the palms were blessed in front of St. Wojciech Church. Many groups then proceeded to sing traditional Polish songs and hymns before one palm was finally declared the winner of this year's contest. Lacking a city gate, colorful costumes, or knowledge of Polish, GA may find this tradition difficult to replicate. There's always next year in Kraków!


