

#### Beloved in Christ,

This year, the Congregation Council has embraced sustainability as a guiding principle for 2025. As I mentioned in church, this means we're intentionally considering the long-term impact – environmental, financial, and missional – in all the decisions we make for Gustavus Adolphus.

Our commitment to sustainability first touches our care for creation. We've already seen this principle in action. When essential HVAC equipment for the lower narthex needed replacement in January, we looked beyond a simple fix. Supported by funds we had set aside, we invested in higher-efficiency units that will reduce our reliance on fossil fuels. Similarly, thanks to a partnership between Xcel Energy and the Center for Energy and Environment, our entire building is receiving an energy-saving LED lighting upgrade at no cost to us. Adding to these efforts, new Wi-Fi thermostats in the narthex allow us to heat and cool spaces only when needed, further trimming our energy use.

But our vision for sustainability extends further, encompassing the long-term health of our church's mission and ministry. We want to ensure GA can thrive for generations to come. This broader view led to a strategic decision when our bookkeeper, Zach, announced his resignation. Instead of seeking another part -time internal hire, the Council chose to engage an external bookkeeping service after careful research, even amidst the busyness of Lent. This move provides crucial stability and allows church leadership to dedicate more energy to ministry and mission, rather than the details of financial administration.

In that same spirit of stewarding our resources well, we continue working with our realtor to find a suitable tenant for the lower level of our education wing. Staff and council leaders have invested time showing the space since January. Finding the right partner will achieve two important goals: it allows our facility to support the valuable work of another organization, and it will contribute financially to the essential maintenance of our building – the home for our worship and community life.

I am truly encouraged and excited to see how this focus on sustainability unfolds in the months ahead. Making these kinds of thoughtful choices is vital work. It strengthens our foundation and helps ensure Gustavus Adolphus remains a vibrant, welcoming community centered in God's love, living out its mission faithfully today and long into the future.

We are continuing our outreach. There are posters near the microwave in the kitchen, so please feel free to take one to a business near you.


We also are heading into the summer months and this means that extra volunteers are always welcome. Check your calendars and see if you might be available to help on some of these dates:


#### **Congregation Read**

This uplifting book reminds us of the healing powers of recognizing "enoughness," for our world, our relationships, and ourselves.

This book is very short - 128 pages. Copies will be available at Church by mid-May. We encourage you to share these copies - either by reading it at Church

during coffee hour or taking it home and bringing it back when complete. You can purchase your own copy from any bookseller. The Hennepin County Library system also has this title available.

References to the book will be included during worship on June 15, 22, and 29. Stewardship will host casual discussions during the Coffee Hour.



## **Monthly Financial Report**

Year-to-date member giving is in line with projections through the end of March with just over \$30,000 in contributions. GA's Finance Manager, Zach Copa, resigned effective April 30. We're thankful for Zach's five years of service to our Church. For a variety of reasons, the Church Council decided to transition to an external bookkeeping, rather than attempt to fill the very part-time Finance Manager position. The same firm that currently handles GA's payroll services will now also handle day-to-day bookkeeping. This change is expected to offer stability and consistency.
