

Dear People,

As I look out the window from my office, the vibrant green of early summer is all around us. The seasons outside our church doors continue their steady progression, just as the seasons inside these walls keep moving forward.

This year, after we celebrate Holy Trinity Sunday on June 15th, we will enter the long and fruitful season of "Ordinary Time." The color in the sanctuary will change to a deep green, reflecting the life and growth of the creation that surrounds us. And just as the colors of our worship space will change, so too will the readings we encounter together.

I am particularly excited that this summer, our weekly Gospel readings will draw us deep into the Gospel of Luke. Following Jesus from the rolling hills of Galilee to the city of Jerusalem, we'll have a unique chance to walk with him through Luke's beautifully detailed account.

Oftentimes, the Sunday morning readings can feel like small bites of larger, complex books of scripture. This can make it challenging to place them in their original context. This is why I so deeply appreciate the coming season in the church. It offers us a chance, week after week, to work our way through one of the Gospels in a more holistic manner.

The Gospel of Luke, for instance, was written as an orderly and compassionate account to reassure its readers of the certainty of what they had been taught. It has a special focus on the forgotten and the overlooked. As we journey through Luke's telling of the good news this summer and into the fall, we will be reminded that:

- God's mercy is radical and available to all, especially those on the margins of society.
- Jesus's ministry consistently challenged social structures and called people to a life of compassion and justice.
- We are called to a discipleship of humility, prayer, and service, reflecting God's own care for the poor and the lost.

This was a powerful message for the early followers of Jesus, and it remains essential good news for us today. In a world where many feel overlooked or left behind, Luke's Gospel grounds us in the truth that God's table has room for everyone.

"The Spirit of the Lord is on me, because he has anointed me to proclaim good news to the poor. He has sent me to proclaim freedom for the prisoners and recovery of sight for the blind, to set the oppressed free, to proclaim the year of the Lord's favor." Luke 4:18-19

As we enter this season of "Ordinary Time," I assure you that the scripture and stories we will encounter in worship are anything but ordinary. I pray that by walking with Jesus through the Gospel of Luke, we will be able to dive even more deeply into the truth and beauty of God's love for creation and our calling to be part of that love in action.

A love that knows no end or boundary!

Rental Update (from the Church Council)

As you likely know, GA is pursuing sharing our space with tenants. Not only will it bring additional income, we are excited about the extra company during the workweek. We have some updates!

Wild Hope Psychological Services contacted the church, seeking a small office to rent. It was fortuitous timing as we had just transitioned to a financial service, freeing up an office previously dedicated to an employee. Upon discussion, the Council voted to sort through the files located in this office, shredding or relocating records. Dr. Nora Halverson will rent this space beginning on July 1, generating an additional \$3900 a year for GA.

Meanwhile, Pastor Ian has been very busy meeting our realtor, Tom, and interested renters over the past several months. One potential tenant, in particular, has taken steps to finalize arrangements to move into the space downstairs. We anticipate that this could happen as early as July. Their rent is still being negotiated, but it will more than replace the income the language school provided GA.

These tenants will join Inspire Home Care and Jesus es la Respuesta; Inspire Home Care rents a suite of two offices upstairs and Jesus es la Respuesta is a church which primarily uses our Fellowship Hall on Thursday evenings and Sunday afternoons. GA also collects rent from the dental office on Johnson Street for the use of our parking lot during the week.

From the Church Council...

Congregational Meeting Sunday, June 8

The church council invites you to a congregational meeting about the parking lot on **Sunday, June 8**, immediately following worship, about 10:45.

You can attend this meeting in person or on zoom. It will be held in the Sanctuary.

GA has been talking about our parking lot for a looooong time. It's a slow-moving project because of the complexity of the work and our limited resources. We are fortunate to have members with expertise in this area who have spent many volunteer hours guiding the work.

On June 8, it is the council's intention to provide an update and if necessary, ask the congregation to vote on the next step.

Recall that in September, 2022, our congregation discussed and voted to move forward with exploring the *minimum work necessary to repair the parking lot for the purpose of parking*. At the same meeting, we rejected the other options of exploring the sale of the parking lot or considering the enhancement of the parking lot and building. Since that time, volunteers have secured a grant from the Mississippi Watershed Management Organization, providing funds covering a portion of the work done thus far. We are eligible, but not guaranteed, funds to cover a portion of future construction costs.

Meanwhile, our congregation made financial commitments to the parking lot and other building needs through the Life Together Capital Appeal. We are in year 2 of a 3-year commitment plan.

Nearly one year ago, our congregation voted to move ahead with a Stormwater Management Package and concept design. This provides us with important information about the soil under the asphalt, and creates drawings that can ultimately be used to collect bids for the work to begin. It cost a total of \$19,850. The Mississippi Watershed Management Organization grant will cover \$8,000, and \$11,850 is covered by funds in our Capital Appeal.

This work is nearly complete. On June 8, you can expect:

- Information about the soil and what sort of remediation and materials it calls for to create a sustainable parking lot.
- A rough estimation of the cost.

A review of the resources we have available from the Life Together Capital Appeal.

Between now and the meeting, we expect to better understand if the money available in the Life Together Capitol Appeal is sufficient to cover the expected cost of the project. In the circumstance of the expected cost exceeding the available resources, we will hold a congregational vote for direction. On the other hand, if the resources are sufficient, we will discuss the next step of bidding out work and payment options.

We are a congregation that values and takes pride in our property. Yet, every decision we make about our property has a long-term impact on our current and future members. It is important that we hear from you during this meeting so we can make a thoughtful plan about this portion of our life together at GA.



We encourage you to share these copies - either by reading it at Church during coffee hour or taking it home and bringing it back when complete. You can purchase your own copy from any bookseller. The Hennepin County Library system also has this title available.

References to the book will be included during worship on June 15, 22, and 29. Stewardship will host casual discussions during the Coffee Hour.



Monthly Financial Report

Year-to-date member giving fell just below projections through the end of April at just over \$100,000. Several improvements to GA's financial practices are occurring this spring, including the transition to an external bookkeeping service, as well as transition to a new digital counter sheet.


