### **South Parking Lot Update**

Thank you to those who attended the congregational meeting on Sunday, June 8, to vote on next steps for the south parking lot.

The congregation voted on two motions. Both motions passed.

- 1. Reallocate capital campaign funds budgeted for the parking lot toward other needs identified in the capital campaign, including the education wing.
- 2. Authorize Council to enter into agreement with a real estate agent to engage potential buyers for the parking lot.

The lot will still be available to park in until it is sold. We are committed to shepherding a new parking culture in our church community so that no one is left behind. We will explore parking needs and options for those requiring this assistance, once the south lot is no longer available.

Council will keep the congregation informed as things progress.

#### Beloved in Christ,

It's been a long time since I was a summer camp participant myself! For many years, starting in elementary school, I attended Pine Lake Camp in Waupaca, WI. Our church seemed to take over the whole camp, with about 100 youth joining in on all the fun. I still remember circle time songs, meals shared in the dining hall, refreshing swims, peaceful nature walks, and morning and evening devotions by the lakeside. And of course, there was canteen time, where we'd eagerly spend our carefully allotted dollars on a candy bar and drink each day. The songs, the smells, the tastes of camp—so many of those memories still stay with me today.

That said, not every camp memory is idyllic. In eighth grade, a nasty Norovirus outbreak swept through Pine Lake. On the very last evening, just when I thought I'd made it through unscathed, I joined about 35 other miserable kids quarantined in one of the cabins. And talk about smells and sounds that stick with you...

But this July, those less-than-fond memories are getting an update! I'm thrilled to be participating with other GA families at Family Camp at Luther Park. It's a wonderful opportunity to rediscover the joy of learning about God in community, surrounded by a different part of creation than what we experience week to week.

At GA, we offer many ways to grow your faith in community, including Sunday worship, community meals, our book group, and choirs. However, camping ministry offers a truly unique experience. In our everchanging world, it still holds the potential for a lasting, transformative impact.

I'm excited to return from camp and share my experiences with all of you. My hope is that in future years, even more folks will be able to experience the joy of building community through camping ministry.

## You Are Welcome Here!


